

## Environmental Management Reducing our Impact

### **Adelaide Cemeteries Environmental Management System**

We are the only cemetery in Australia certified to ISO14001 and remain committed to continuously improving our environmental performance.

#### **Waste**

Reducing our environmental impact starts with avoiding unnecessary use of resources and diverting waste from landfill through recycling streams. Please prioritise resources which are compostable, reusable, or recyclable.

#### **Biodiversity**

As stewards of the natural ecosystems within our cemeteries, you must avoid harming our plants, soils and water sources while onsite. It is vital that you advise us promptly of any incident or activity that has potential to cause harm.

- Cheltenham Cemetery is undergoing 'greening' with several locations that will be revegetated with small native shrubs and groundcovers mid-2024. We ask you to please avoid activities in these areas.
- Folland Park Reserve borders Wirra Wonga at Enfield Memorial Park and contains remnant mallee woodland. Please keep to defined walkways to avoid unnecessary disturbance of native vegetation corridors.
- At West Terrace Cemetery, five locations are signed as 'remnant vegetation'. Unless you are conducting approved conservation activities you must not enter these areas.
- Smithfield Memorial Park is frequented by local wildlife. Please take care when driving throughout the park and look out for ducks and lizards regularly seen wandering the grounds.

As a supplier to Adelaide Cemeteries, please ensure:

- consideration is given to the surrounding environment, and care is taken when conducting activities
- any equipment or signage is adequately secured
- any packaging or rubbish that is generated, is secured and taken with you when you leave
- if you identify an issue that could cause negative environmental impact, you immediately report to your site contact.
